Parshas Terumah

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The Yalkut Shimoni asks on the verse "חַרְּיָלְי תְּרוּמֶה - and you should take for Me a gift", that why did Hashem need to ask for donations? Hashem owns the entire world from the heavens to the earth! He therefore explains the word "לִי" as not about asking for the donations but rather as an overarching purpose for the Mishkan! Hashem desires to live amongst his people like a father desires to be with his son and therefore Hashem is expressing that the purpose of the Mishkan is for "Me" - For Hashem's sake because he wants to dwell amongst us!

The Yalkut Shimoni goes on to explain that Hashem used a terminology of "דָּבֵּת" which means speak to the Jewish people gently with compassion and pacification. It's very difficult to ask people for money despite the fact that the Mishkan served a great benefit for the Jewish people as a repentance for the sins of the golden calf and a great honor that they had Hashem in their midst. Hashem therefore asked Moshe to speak to them gently. It seems that the Yalkut Shemoni is expressing that because the main purpose of the Mishkan is for a fulfillment of Hashem's desire, so to speak, Hashem therefore needed to pacify the Jewish people.

We see from here the great love that *Hashem* has for the Jewish people. That *Hashem* expressed the purpose of the *Mishkan* primarily as "For Me" is incredible! And the fact that it was so for *Hashem's* sake that *Hashem* had to pacify them shows that Hashem's purpose was very much the primary purpose! Despite the fact that the Jewish people had so many reasons to **want** and to **need** the building of this Mishkan, *Hashem* still saw it, so to speak, as mainly for Him!

We cannot possibly fathom the great and eternal love that *Hashem* has for the Jewish people!

We have many reasons why we love *Hashem* and need *Hashem* among us but His love for us

dwarfs all! This is what is being expressed when it says "יְי"!

When we read this in the *Torah* this week, we should keep in mind this *Pasuk* expresses the highest degree of *Hashem's* love for us!
